Since the project began in 2004, over a 1,000 arts and cultural organizations have submitted their data to the Pennsylvania Cultural Data Project (Pennsylvania CDP). This project is the most ambitious and comprehensive effort ever to gather and analyze information about the contributions of the cultural sector to Pennsylvania's economy and quality of life. The Pennsylvania CDP is a state-wide, collaborative effort of public and private funders and consists of an online system for collecting and standardizing historical financial and organizational data. Many funders throughout Pennsylvania now require applicants to complete a Cultural Data Profile as part of their application process.
